# CHOCOLATE WHEEL ON BAND NIGHTS

Mr. J. E. Palmer, secretary of the Railway Queen Committee, wrote to the City Council last night for permission to operate a chocolate wheel in Macchattie Park on Wednesday evenings during the currency of the Queen Competitions on behalf of the Railway Queen. Ald. Webb said there were three queens and there would be three chocolate wheels. He seconded Ald. Tipping's motion.

Ald. Beddie said it would interfere with those who liked to hear the music and would be distasteful to the band. If it were held outside somewhere, he would be favorable to it. He did not think they should interfere with the band's weekly programme of music.

Ald. Ennis said he would like to see the chocolate wheel, but he was of the same opinion as Ald. Beddie. He did not think they should interfere with the band while it was playing in the park, and he did not think Mr. Lewins would like it. The chocolate wheel would have to be some distance from the band. That distance should be stated, otherwise they would get as close to the band as they could. A lot of people seemed to think that the thing was overdone.
